### Meet your Lecturers

**Dr. William Townsend, OD**



Dr. Townsend is a graduate of the University of Houston College of Optometry. In addition to his private practice he served for eleven years as a consultant at the VA Medical Center in Amarillo, Texas. Dr. Townsend is currently an adjunct professor at the University of Houston College of Optometry and a preceptor for senior externs who rotate through his practice. Dr. Townsend conducts research in pharmaceutical agents, contact lens materials and solutions, with special emphasis on ocular surface disease and dry eye. He is a fellow of the American Academy of Optometry and President of the Ocular Surface Society of Optometry.

## Alan Kabat, OD



Dr. Alan Kabat, OD graduated from Rutgers University with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Biological Science. He earned his Doctor of Optometry degree from the Pennsylvania College of Optometry and completed his residency training at John F. Kennedy Memorial Hospital in Philadelphia. Dr. Kabat is a Fellow of the American Academy of Optometry and his research has been published extensively in various optometric journals and literature.

## Richard Castillo, O.D., D.O.



Richard Castillo, O.D., D.O., is a graduate of the Oklahoma College of Optometry and the OSU College of Osteopathic Medicine and Surgery. He completed a medical/surgical residency in Comprehensive Ophthalmology/Ophthalmic Surgery at Oklahoma State University, and is a past director of the OSU Ophthalmology service. He has been NSU-OCO's principle surgeon, and a clinical professor of Optometry since 1998. He has a subspecialty interest in anterior segment microsurgery and oculoplastics. As Professor, Assistant Dean for Surgical Training and Education, and Chief of the NSU-OCO Surgery Service, he is responsible for overseeing all facets of NSU-OCO's surgical program, a program he helped pioneer going back to 1996. He introduced office-based radiosurgery to NSU and the profession in 1998, a treatment modality which has become commonplace in all states with Optometric Advanced Practice and Surgical Legislation. For the past two decades, Dr. Castillo has remained a strong and aggressive proponent of optometric CME, holding workshops on Advanced Office Procedures, minor surgery, lasers, and office-based anesthesia both nationally and internationally. Dr. Castillo is

the author of several textbook chapters, including the iconic Rosenbloom's Vision & Aging, where he co-authored the text's introductory chapter, and the equally iconic Pfenninger & Fowler's Procedures for Primary Care, which has been included in the list of the 100 most influential texts in medicine. He is the chair and commissioner of the National Commission on Vision and Health. He has served on numerous committees for the National Board of Examiners in Optometry. Dr. Castillo was recently honored with a Special Citation from the Oklahoma House of Representatives for Outstanding Contributions to the Advancement of Surgical Optometric Care in the State of Oklahoma. He was honored with a similar award from the Oklahoma State Board of Examiners in Optometry in the winter of 2015.
